Numerical linear algebraic problems in large-scale massively parallel electronic state calculations on the K computer

The present paper presents the numerical linear algebraic problems and their solution algorithms in our large-scale massively parallel electronic state calculations; [1] (i) generalized eigen-value problem $(A\mathbf{y} = \lambda B\mathbf{y})$ for whole [2] and partial [3] eigen pairs, (ii) generalized shifted linear equations $((zB - A)\mathbf{x} = \mathbf{b})$ [4-6], (iii) Schrödinger-like dynamical equation $(d\mathbf{u}/dt = -iA\mathbf{u})$ or its formal solution $(\mathbf{u}(t + \delta t) := \exp(-i\delta tA)\mathbf{u}(t))$. They appear in structure (molecular dynamics) simulation or quantum transport (hole wave packet dynamics) simulation of nano material applications, such as organic electronic devices. Our simulation code is called 'ELSES' (=Extra Large-Scale Electronic Structure calculation) [1] and was optimized for the K computer and other massively parallel supercomputers. We prepared a matrix data collection of 'ELSES Matrix Library', [7] an open database of our real problems for numerical analysis researchers. Several recent papers are listed below and older ones can be found in the papers or the web sites [1].
